A Bible Story about Fellowship:


In another story, a very religious man by the name of Nicodemus came to Jesus very late at night. He asked Jesus how he could become part of the Kingdom of God. Jesus told him that everyone who wants to be part of God's family must be born again. If you remember that story Nicodemus did not understand this. He asked Jesus how anyone could go back and be born all over again. It sounded silly to Nicodemus that a person could be born like a new born baby again. Jesus said you had to be born physically and spiritually. When we ask God to forgive us, God forgives us and it is just like starting our life all over again – we are "born again" but this time we are born as part of God's family. John 3:1–21
